



NOTICE OF RACE

The Hellenic Sailing Federation, are pleased to invite Finn sailors to take part in the:

PRE EUROPEAN "EASTER FINN REGATTA"

in Athens International Sailing Center, Greece from 22nd - 25th April 2019

1. RULES

- 1.1 The Championships will be governed by the Rules as defined in the WS Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020(RRS).
- 1.2 The class Rules (unless otherwise modified by the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions)
- 1.3 This Notice of Race.
- 1.4 The Sailing Instructions.
- 1.5. National Authority prescriptions will not apply except the Hellenic Sailing Federation Prescription No1 to the RRS: «In RRS 40 PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICES is added: All participants at a race, including competitors, support personnel and race officials on board speed boats/ribs shall wear a PFD during the races».
- 1.6 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2. [DP] [SP] [NP] ADVERTISING AND BOW NUMBERS

2.1 Boats may be required to display bow numbers and/or advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

3.1 This Regatta is open forbthe Olympic Class: Heavyweight Dinghy: Finn

4. CLASSIFICATION

No classification requirements will apply (see RRS 79).

5. FEES

5.1 The entry fee is EUR 70 per boat (the price includes coach's rib too)

Entry fees will be paid during Registration

5.4 These entry fees include all collective services provided by the organization, such as social events, boat park facilities, toilets and showers.

6. RACING FORMAT

- 6.1 All boats will race in a single fleet.
- 6.2 9 final races are scheduled.

- 7.2 No warning signal will be given after 16:00 on the last day.
- 7.3 No more than three races shall be sailed each day.

8. [DP] [NP] MEASUREMENT

- 8.1 A Technical Committee shall be appointed in accordance with RRS 92
- 8.2 Each boat shall produce a valid Measurement Certificate, including the completed Measurement Form, at the time of Registration.
- 8.3 In accordance with RRS 78, competitors are responsible for maintaining their boat in accordance with the Class Rules (for the purpose of RRS 78, competitors are considered to be the owners). Equipment checks will be performed at random during the regatta.

9. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

9.1 Sailing Instructions will be available during registration at the Race Office and at the Championships website. Other documents governing the event will be published with the Sailing Instructions.

11. THE COURSES

11.1 The courses will be Windward/Leeward or Trapezoid.

12. PENALTY SYSTEM & INTERNATIONAL JURY.

12.1 RRS Appendix P, Special Procedures for RRS 42, will apply.





12.2. RRS P2.3 will not apply and RRS P2.2 is changed so that it will apply to any penalty after the first one.

13. SCORING

- 13.1 The Low- Point Scoring System will apply.
- 13.2. There will be 9 races in a single series.
- 13.3 Discards

When fewer than 3 races have been completed, a boat's series score is the total of her race scores. When 3 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score is the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

14. [DP] [NP] SUPPORT TEAMS

- 14.1 All Support Team members shall be registered with the Organizing Authority (see 3.3 & 5.4) and will be required to comply with local legislation and event support team regulations. All boat drivers should have a valid Certificate of Competency of a seagoing vessel. The Organizing Authority may refuse registrations and accept later registrations at their sole discretion.
- 14.2 Registered Support Team boats shall fly a flag with their three-letter national code (see RRS G1.1) clearly displayed or shall be permanently marked with a sticker of their three letter national code on each side of the boat or engine. The minimum height for the letters shall be 200 mm. The letters will not be provided by the Organizing Authority.
- 14.3 Registered Support Team boats shall act as assistance / rescue boats in case of need and shall comply with any instruction given by the Race Committee or the Organizing Authority.
- 14.4 All Support Team boats shall have third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of EUR 800.000 or equivalent per incident.

15. [DP] [NP] BERTHING

When berthed, boats shall be kept in their assigned place at the boat park

16. PRIZES AND TITLES

- The first three crews in the ranking list shall be given a trophy.
- Other special prizes could be announced in the SI.

17. RISK STATEMENT

- 17.1 Competitors and Support Team members participate in the Championships entirely at their own risk and they are reminded of the provisions of RRS 4, Decision to Race. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- 17.1.1 They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;





- 17.1.2 They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- 17.1.3 They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- 17.1.4 By participating in any race, they are satisfied that their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- 17.1.5 The provision of a race management team, safety boats, judges and other officials and volunteers by the organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- 17.1.6 The provision of safety boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- 17.1.7 They will familiarize themselves with any venue/event specific risks, adhere to rules and information produced for the venue/event and they will attend any venue/event safety briefings.
- 17.2 The Organising Authority and all parties involved in the regatta organisation will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

18. [DP] [NP] MEDIA RIGHTS, CAMERAS AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

- 18.1 By participating in the Championships competitors automatically grant to the Organizing Authority and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.
- 18.2 Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment or positioning equipment as specified by the Organizing Authority and in accordance with the relevant class rules.

19. INSURANCE

- 19.1 Each 'person in charge' (see RRS 46) shall hold a valid insurance certificate showing proof of third-party liability with a minimum coverage per incident of EUR 1.500.000 per event or equivalent. The Organizing Authority is not responsible for verifying the status or validity of such certificates.
- 19.2 It will be possible to purchase a third party insurance covering the duration of the Championships at registration.
